Summer Food Insecurity: Why Our Neighbors Need our Help

Summer is a time often associated with the fun of outdoor activities, barbecues and family gatherings. However, for those in our community who are facing hard times this isn't the typical summer reality. Food insecurity, or consistent lack of enough food to have a healthy life because of your economic situation (Feeding America.org), affects over one third of Coloradans. Food price increases are still very much a reality; housing costs continue to rise and the tenuous nature of housing situations causes instability for many families. The realities of life – accidents, medical emergencies, broken relationships, job insecurities – strain family economic situations. And, in the summer, children don't have access to the same level of food support through their schools. The average SNAP benefit (formerly known as food stamps) per meal is only \$1.76; 12% of residents in Boulder County are unable to access adequate, nutritious food; and, 16% of children lack access to proper nutrition.

The Round Pantry sees the results of these situations in higher demand than ever before. On April 25, Round Pantry Drive Line reached a record high of 535 households served in a single day and food was provided the next day through Community Distribution to almost 500 for a total of just over 1000 households within one week.

Community Food Share continues its valiant work providing tons of food to The Round Pantry. And yet, to see that no one ever leaves the Pantry without food, more is needed. The Round Pantry budget, funded entirely by donations, purchased over 5,000 pounds of food in April alone. Another important source of food is direct donation. Non-perishable food items can be dropped off in the blue shopping cart in Westview's Narthex or during Pantry operations, which occur every month on the 2nd & 4th Sunday afternoons, and all day Mondays and Tuesdays. The most needed items (especially during summer months) are cereal, breakfast bars, canned meals, canned soup, and peanut butter.

Though the challenge not only continues, it increases, and caring individuals continue to work to alleviate food insecurity. Though it is easy to not notice or be unaware of the needs around us, it is important to recognize that many people, especially those with children, face a heavy burden not just during the summer but all year long. Donating your time and resources to The Round Pantry can help to lighten this burden and provide access to nutritious food during the summer and beyond. westviewpres.org/round-pantry-signups

#### SafeLot SHELTER

A great big thank you to all of you who have contributed food and funds for the monthly dinners Westview has provided for guests of the SafeLot Program. This wonderful program that helps homeless people with a shower, food, and help to regain work and dignity finds permanent shelter for one person or a couple each week on the average. Westviewers provide a dinner for 12 people every third Friday of each month. YOU can help by providing a main dish, vegetable, salad, or dessert or by donating funds to the shelter account at Westview.
